Identifying the right source our success is a very serious matter:

- If he places his trust in his wisdom and tactics, physical strength and industriousness he will toil for nothing, his strength will weaken, and his tactics will fall short of accomplishing his desire,...and "I returned and saw under the sun, that the race does not belong to the swift, nor the war to the mighty; neither do the wise have bread ... (Koheles 9:11),....
